Also provides Community Voice Mail, providing reliable and private access to telephone-based communication essential for clients to access housing and other support services. Share Service Center	Share Outreach will expand to include a new Share Service Center to provide a clean, safe, and welcoming facility where homeless and chronically homeless individuals and families can come to use restroom facilities, showers, and laundry equipment. The Center will include a day resource room where clients may access phones, voice mail, internet, and community resources.			\$ 55,780	
YWCA SafeChoice Domestic Violence Program	Serves victims of domestic violence by providing a 24-hour crisis line, shelter, children's advocacy program, legal advocacy, counseling, support groups, and community education. The objective of the program is to reduce and prevent the number of homeless families by maintaining current domestic violence services and expanding emergency rental assistance.			\$ 405,450	
YW Housing Ready to Rent Program	A 6-week rental education class designed to help people learn how to be successful renters and deal with barriers to rental housing, such as no rental history, evictions, and poor credit history. Participants receive information, encouragement, and specific steps they can take to overcome barriers, manage money, find affordable housing, and be a responsible tenant. R2R includes a landlord Guarantee Fund and client incentives to assist in program participation. YW Housing also assists with maintenance and utility costs associated with housing. Funds maintain the homes thus keeping rents stable.				\$ 56,100
Share Shetler Programs & Hunger Response	Share operates four homeless shelters year-round: Share House, Inn at the Orchard, Valley Homestead, and the Women's Shelter. The Winter Hospitality Overflow operates from November through March. Share House serves homeless men; Inn at the Orchard and Valley Homestead serve families and women; the Women's Shelter serves single women; and Winter Hospitality Overflow provides bednights to families, couples, and single men at local churches.	\$ 36,000	\$ 506,000	\$ 463,600
