



## SEX OFFENDER NOTIFICATION

The Clark County Sheriffs Office is releasing the following information pursuant to RCW 4.24.550 which authorizes law enforcement agencies to inform the public when the release of information on convicted felony sex offenders, who are required to register, will enhance public safety and protection.

The individual who appears on this notification has been convicted of a sex offense that requires registration with the Sheriffs Office. Further, his criminal history places him in a classification, which reflects the potential to re-offend. **HE IS NOT WANTED BY THE POLICE AT THIS TIME**

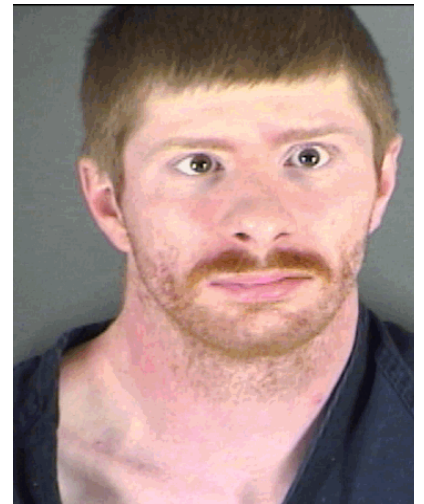
This individual has served the sentence imposed on him by the courts and has advised this office that he is living in the location below. An informed public is a safer public. Notification is not intended to increase fear. Sex offenders have always lived in our communities. The Clark County Sheriff's Office has no legal authority to direct sex offenders as to where they may live, work, or regularly be found. Unless restricted by a court order, sex offenders are constitutionally permitted to live wherever they chose.

Using this public information to threaten, intimidate or harass sex offenders will not be tolerated by the enforcement agencies of Clark County. In 1998, during an investigation of another crime in Skamania County, Brown was found to be in possession of approximately 300 pairs of women's underwear which were later determined to have been stolen from laundromats.

Brown recently registered as transient. He will be monitored by the Department of Corrections, and the Clark County Sex Offender Registration Unit.
