Community Youth Holiday Event – December 15, 2011

We had a very successful event this year with many kids and their families attending this year, the most we ever had in the 13 years. The donations were very good this year, in fact we received more donations from more places and from more people that we have ever had. The total count of kids this year was 600 as compared to 735 last year.

Each kid who attended received a wrapped gift. Ruffled off were 22 bikes (20 donated by Waste Connections). 20 cases of fresh fruit were donated by local grocery stores were handed out to the kids as they left the event. McDonalds provided 800

freshly baked sugar cookies that the kids could decorate and eat or just eat. Burgerville served hot chocolate and McDonald's provided orange drink. To families in need 200 boxes of food. Over 600 bags of Frito-Lay chips were given to families. Salmon Creek Mini Storage was gracious enough to donate a 10X10 space in their storage business to store all the toys prior to the event.

Hewlett-Packard provided cameras, photo printers, ink and photo paper along with some employee volunteers to take and print pictures of kids with Santa. 7 Christmas trees that were donated by Yard & Gardenland. In addition to the gifts and food, there was face painting and cookie decorating. Ronald McDonald and Mr. McFun put on a show to entertain the kids and their parents. Overall, approximately 100 people volunteered to help organize and hold the event. A Spanish interpreter helped translate during the party. Smiles Dental in Hazel Dell also participated.

We offer a very special thanks to Vancouver School District and the staff at Sarah J. Anderson School for their help and support along with the PTA. This was the 13th year hosting the event and it could not have been done without the help from our community. It's great to live in a community that cares.

This is a community-wide event with support from neighborhood associations across the county, especially from the Hazel Dell and Salmon Creek area. Luke Jensen Sports Park Opening Day/ Dedication is March 17th

Luke Jensen Sports Park located at 4000 NE 78th Street is nearing completion and a date has been set for the sports park opening day and dedication, Saturday, March 17th. Opening day ceremonies will begin at 9:00 AM and are expected to last a couple hours. Food will be served following the ceremonies and throwing of the "first" pitch.

The 20-acre park was developed in 2011-12 as part of the Greater Clark

Parks District program. Facilities include 3 synthetic turf multi-use sports fields, 2 natural turf Little League sports fields, batting cages, a small playground with equipment, restrooms, concessions space, parking lots, walking trail, and picnic tables & benches.

The primary users of this facility are Salmon Creek Little League and Westside Soccer Club. Other youth and adult sports groups may also reserve field time based on a scheduling prioritization established in the Preliminary Operations and Use Fee Policy for Luke Jensen Sports Park. The fields will be available for unorganized, public use approximately 10% of the year, or when not already reserved.



The sports park is named after Luke Jensen, a local 9-year-old boy, who died from leukemia in May 2010. Luke attended King's Way Christian Schools, which are located west of the sports park. Naming the sports park in memory of Luke was proposed and voted on, along with several other suggested names, as part of a public process.
