ANNOUNCEMENTS

Doug updated the group on Mike Nolan's condition. Saturday, June 19th is the Jack E. Fazio park designation located at 9600 NW 21st Ave.

The West Precinct Safety Fair open house will be held on September 18 from noon to four. National Preparedness month is Nov. The code consistency hearing is June 22 at the Public Service Center. We received thank you notes from Bill Barron and Mary Keltz for their employee of the year awards.

VANCOUVER TREATMENT SOLUTIONS – Julie St. Clair – They are now celebrating 5 years in their present location with no problems. They have 270 patients with 25% coming from Cowlitz County and 75% coming from Clark County.

SW WASHINGTON AGENCY ON AGING AND DISABILITIES – Lexie Bartunek – This agency is a clearing house for information needed by aging citizens about programs available in the community. It provides multiple services, including a family caregiver support program. Specialists answer the phone inquiries and they receive over 500/month. Case workers work with Medicaid patients. The agency helps to give family care givers time off and they offer "boot camp" workshops for care givers. The agency offers prescription help, advice on legal assistance, fitness classes, etc.

COMMUNITY MILITARY APPRECIATION COMMITTEE – Dan Tarbell – CMAC was founded a year ago begun by 40 et 8, a veteran's organization honor society. They spearhead the Memorial Day and Veterans' Day celebrations. CMAC has 25 organizations helping them and would like NACCC to get the word out for other organizations or companies who would like to partner with them. They support all families who have a member deployed. They are holding a parade for kids on July 4 at Fort Vancouver and welcome kids with or without their bikes to come all dressed up for the celebration and to march in the parade.

NEIGHBORHOOD ROUNDTABLE

Greater Brush Prairie – Robyn Kim – They had their general meeting recently and invited Andersen Plastics to come to discuss their future location near the railroad. The old Cenex property is changing to heavy industrial and they are asking for a light industrial designation.

East Minnehaha – Sue Lintz – Bylaws indicate that Sue needs to step down as President. Henry Hughes is running for president. The parks dept. is asking for 10 acres for a park.

Truman – Marelyn Curtis – Volunteers have decided to form a council and not a board. They will meet again to designate jobs. They didn't hear back from Mike McCabe about crime watch and Holly suggested Marelyn call her and she will help expedite.

CC Railroad Advisory Board – Dick Claremont – Dick will be their new representative to NACCC and was happy to answer questions and promises to keep us updated. Daniel Weaver is his back-up.

CC Public Health – Johnie Hyde – They will be coming regularly to our meetings and are outreaching to the community to create healthy neighborhoods.

Port of Vancouver – Andrew Ness – Their next meeting will deal with an RTC issue and will study truck corridors. Farwest wants to buy the Port's surplus 22 acres to bring in steel manufacturing (fabricating). The commission has not yet voted on it. Farwest says they will bring in 100 jobs at a \$40,000/year average.

CC Public Works – Jeff Mize – There will be a meeting in front of the hearings examiner on the Hazel Dell Sports fields. Public Works is working on storm water retrofitting. Clark County joined the small cities to form a consortium on storm water maintenance. They received a \$238,000 grant.

Fairgrounds – Bridget Schwarz – Bridget said that a property owner brought in a lot of dirt with no permit and called it "soil amendment" which does not require a permit. NUSA had a great conference. President Clinton spoke.

NE Hazel Dell – Bud Van Cleve – Their meeting will be tomorrow night and will be their annual ice cream social. Commissioner Marc Boldt is overseeing the task force on readiness for aging. There is a meeting on June 17 in the commissioner's hearing room at 2 p.m.

Felida – Milada Allen – North Salmon Creek NA is partnering with Felida on the Independence Day parade and activities. The Lewis and Clark expedition camp will be set up. All those with booths should set up at 9 a.m. Hwy. 99 is on the planning commission agenda this Thursday to form base code.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:20 p.m.
