Driving Directions:

From I-5, take Exit 5 (NE 99th Street) and head east on 99th Street. Turn left onto Highway 99. Travel north for just under one mile. Turn left onto NE 117th Street. The park entrance will be on your right just after you cross under the bridge.

PICNIC SHELTER RESERVATIONS:

Can I reserve the shelters at Salmon Creek Regional Park/Klineline Pond?

Yes. Salmon Creek Regional Park/Klineline Pond has two reservable picnic shelters.

How do I make a reservation?

To reserve a picnic shelter at Salmon Creek Regional Park/Klineline Pond, call or visit the Marshall Community Center (1009 E. McLoughlin Blvd. in Vancouver; Phone: 360-487-7100). Shelters can be reserved for events held from May 1 to September 30. Reservations are taken starting the first working day of February each year.

How much does it cost to reserve a shelter?

Both shelters cost \$50 per day to reserve. The fees help pay for maintenance and operation of the shelters. When not already reserved, the shelters are available at no charge on a first-come, first-served basis.

How large are the shelters?

Both shelters can accommodate groups of up to 50 people.

What types of amenities do the shelters have?

The Pond View shelter features six standard picnic tables and trash cans, and is located close to the playground. The Creekside shelter features seven standard picnic tables and trash cans, and is located between the open lawn area and Salmon Creek towards the back of the park. There is no power or water available at either shelter.

SPECIAL EVENTS:

Can I have a special event at the park?

Yes. Special events, such as company picnics, birthday parties, family reunions and athletic events are allowed. A Special Use Permit is required for events featuring inflatable bounce houses and amplified music, and for any large, public events such as fishing derbies and sporting events. Special Use Permits can be obtained from Vancouver-Clark Parks and Recreation by calling 360-619-1123 or e-mailing Brian.Potter@ci.vancouver.wa.us.

Can I reserve the beach or grassy area near the lake for a special event?

No, the beach and grassy areas near the lake are not reservable. However, special events, such as weddings, may be allowed on a case-by-case basis with an approved Special Use Permit. Please call 360-619-1123 or e-mail Brian.Potter@ci.vancouver.wa.us to get more information.

Can I bring a "bounce house" or dunk tank to the park?

Air-inflated "bounce houses" may be allowed in the park with an approved Special Use Permit. However, dunk tanks are not allowed.



Park Rules

The following activities are not allowed (County Code 9.04):

- Littering/vandalism
- Alcohol possession or consumption
- Discharging firearms
- Motorized vehicles outside the parking lots
- Disorderly conduct
- Camping
- Bonfires
- Horseback riding
- Unleashed animals
- Cruising and squirreling

PARKING FEES:

How much does it cost to park?

Parking at Salmon Creek Regional Park/Kliline Pond costs \$3 for cars, \$2 for motorcycles, \$6 for vehicles with trailers and \$8 for buses and RVs. Pedestrians and bicyclists may enter for free. Parking fees will be charged starting in May. Parking fees may also be collected at any time during scheduled special events.

Will I be charged a parking fee to drop someone or something off in the park?

No. You will not be charged a parking fee if you are in the park for less than 15 minutes. You just need to check in with the park fee collector before entering.

If I have to leave the park and return later the same day, do I have to pay the parking fee again?

No. If you keep your parking receipt, you can re-enter any Clark County regional park an unlimited number of times on the same day without paying again.

Can I pay the parking fees for guests attending my event?

Yes. Ask about a parking contract when you apply for your Special Use Permit. The county charges a \$25 processing fee, plus \$3 per car.

Can I bring my RV?

Yes. There is a designated RV parking area at Salmon Creek Regional Park/Kliline Pond. Your parking fee will depend on the size of your RV.

OTHER QUESTIONS:

Can I bring my dog(s)?

Leashed dogs are allowed in the parking lot and on the Salmon Creek Greenway Trail. Owners must also obey local scoop laws and pick up after their pets. Dogs are **not** allowed in the Kliline Pond recreation area across the footbridge from the parking lot.

Is there playground equipment?

Yes. There is a playground between the two reservable picnic shelters.

Can I swim in Kliline Pond?

Yes, swimming is allowed within the roped off area of Kliline Pond closest to the sandy beach. There are no lifeguards and the sprayground water feature has been closed due to 2010 budget cuts.

How do I know if the lake is safe to swim in?

An algae bloom or unsafe levels of E. coli bacteria may sometimes require the county to close the lake to all water contact. Fee collectors will inform park visitors about closures and advisory signs will be posted. The rest of the park will remain open. Can I bring my boat?

No. Motorized and non-motorized boats are not allowed in Kliline Pond.
