Veterans are eligible for assistance from the fund as outlined in Clark County's Policies and Procedures.

They must be:

- discharged from the any branch of the armed forces with a rating of anything other than dishonorable;
- have lived in Washington State for at least one year; and
- currently reside in Clark County.
- Meet income eligibility
